

Beaver's Acre

Beaver's Acre is five open-air sleeping shelters. Five open air cabins with bunk style beds with mattresses. This unit is wheelchair accessible and is mostly level. Program shelter has tables with benches and a 3 burner propane stove, gear locker and the fire circle is close to the program shelter. Water and pit latrine are in the unit. This unit can sleep 28.



Bureau

The Bureau sleeps 6 and has electricity and a covered porch with a view of Lake Devereaux. This unit is uphill from the waterfront and has a wonderful view of the lake. Electricity and bunks with mattresses. No close bathroom. Could use the waterfront latrine or Pixie unit bathroom.



Frontier

Frontier contains small platforms, tents (April-October), a program shelter with cook stove, gear locker, outdoor fire circle, latrine, and cold water. Capacity is 16. This platform tent unit is located along the Lake Trail. Some of the tent sites are on the hillside along with the latrine. The program shelter is at the top of the hill from the tent sites. There is a fireplace, gear locker, tables with benches. The fire circle is just down the hill from the program shelter. You may drive up to the program shelter to drop off equipment.



Huckleberry Hut

Huckleberry Hut is a Program Shelter-open building with fireplace and electricity, and cold water. Uses the parking lot latrine. The Huckleberry hut is just off the parking lot and share the parking lot pit latrine. It is close to the playfield and Okashi. There is cold water at the site, three burner propane stove, table with benches, fireplace, gear locker.



Lodge of Nations

The Lodge of Nations is a large room with a central fireplace, covered porch, outdoor fire circle, and no electrical heat. Use central shower house for restroom. Food service for groups of 35 and over available for a fee. Food service seating capacity is 220. Can be rented with or without kitchen. This is not a sleeping area. The Lodge of Nations is west of Okashi and south of Skogly. Used for meetings and food service. The lodge has flags from many different countries. Tables with benches, fireplace. Seating for 220. The kitchen area is an institutional kitchen service units need to have taken quantity cooking. Institutional dishwasher, serving ware and dishes. Lodge of Nations fire circle is just outside the eastside doors.



Misty Point

Misty Point is a tent or tarp site. This site contains a program shelter with fireplace and cook stove, latrine, cold water, and a fire circle. Capacity is 30+. Program shelter has tables with benches, gear locker, and fireplace. Pit latrine is close to the program shelter and the fire circle is closer to the lake and close to the tent area. View of the tent area from the fire circle. You can also see the program shelter from the fire circle. There is a path by the tent area that leads to the lakeshore. This photo shows the slope that the camp road has from the main road. The gate can be opened by the camp personnel to let a car come down to the site to unload. The gate is locked.



Mountaineer

Mountaineer contains platform tents (April-October), a program shelter with cook stove, gear locker, outdoor fire circle, latrine, and cold water. Capacity is 28. You may drive part of the way to this unit. You will need to walk your gear down a slight incline to get from your car to the unit. You may also walk to this unit using the lake train. These are large tents on platforms, bunks with platforms. The program shelter has tables with benches, 3 burner propane stove, fire place, water and gear locker. The pit latrine is up a slight grade. A path at the far end away from the program shelter takes you to the lake.



Okashi Nokoya Lodge

Okashi Nokoya Lodge has a large room with a fireplace, kitchen, electric stove, refrigerator, hot and cold water, flush plumbing, shower, outdoor fire circle, electric heat, and a gear locker. Capacity 20. This unit has electrical outlets. Okashi from the parking lot on it east side. Okashi is just east of the Lodge of Nations. It is also close to the Huckleberry house and the all camp shower house. This unit has a full kitchen and microwave. It also has a complete gear locker. There is a washer and dryer in this unit There are 2 bathrooms, but only one shower. The fire circle can be seen from the east side door. The camp flag pole is outside the west door along with the Lodge of Nations fire circle.



Pioneer

Pioneer is five open-air shelters (3 walls), each sleeps 6, program shelter with cook stove, outdoor fire circle, latrines, cold water. Capacity 30. From the 3 sided sleep shelters follow the path down to the Lake trail and turn to your right to access this units program shelter and fire circle.



Pixie Blue and Green

The Pixie Units are 2 enclosed sleeping cabins with heat and electricity. The Shower house is in unit with flush plumbing. The program shelter is down the hill and contains cook stoves, fire circle, cold water, electricity, and gear lockers. This unit is wheelchair accessible. The capacity at this site is 28



Skogly Lodge

Skogly Lodge consists of a large room with a fireplace, kitchen area, electric stove, hot and cold water, flush plumbing, and shower, and electric heat. This area has and outdoor fire circle, gear locker, and three sided sleeping shelters has a capacity of 18 occupants, the lodge's capacity is 30. Total capacity for this site 48.



Whispering Winds (Mariah & Chinook)

Whispering Winds (Mariah & Chinook) are eight open-air sleeping shelters, with a double-sided program shelter, with cook stoves, fire circles, latrine, cold water, and gear lockers. Capacity is 48. Mariah (24) and Chinook (24) and can be rented individually or together.



Points of Interest



The Arboretum is a self-guided walk with stations pointing out local flora. Activity sheets are available at the Arboretum sign. The area is maintained by the Friends of St Albans.



The Archery Range:

Archery is available for Junior through Adult Girl Scouts (Safety-wise). Troops are required to provide their own trained archery supervisor.



Lake Devereaux: Ninety-seven acre natural lake. WA State Dept. of Fish and Wildlife stock the lake annually and maintain the public fishing access. Fishing season from late April to late October. Fishing license required.

Waterfront: Row a Viking boat, an 18-foot rowing boat with carved head, unique to St Albans. Canoes and swimming (dependent upon the water temperature) available. All waterfront activities must be under the supervision of certified personnel.



Rock Memorial Fire Circle: Located between Pioneer and Frontier sites. This large fire circle provides a beautiful setting for any story or ceremony.

Playfield: The Playfield is located near the Huckleberry Hut and is one acre of open playfield for activities. Playfield equipment (parachute, sports equipment, volleyball, etc.) available for checkout from camp host.

Frog Pond: Hike a mile out to Frog Pond and enjoy other trails in the Back 40.
