









Lesson Title Gloria—Respect Myself and Others

### Lesson Overview:

In this lesson, girls will work on their Respect Myself and Others (purple) petal.

- Talk about what it means to be respectful of myself and of others.
- Read or Watch Video of the story Chrysanthemum. Continue discussion.
- Name sheet activity saying disrespectful things to others has an ever lasting impact.

# Lesson Title Gloria—Respect Myself and Others

## **Lesson Delivery**

- Say the Girl Scout Promise and Law with your Girl Scout(s).
- Ask for examples of times when girls have been respectful of themselves and others. (5 min)
- Read the book or watch the video, Chrysanthemum. (10-15 min)
- Discuss the story and ask what it means to be respectful. Have girls give examples of how they can respect themselves and others. (5 min)
- Pull out the markers/crayons and sheets of paper. Have each Girl Scout and adult write their name in big letters on their own sheet. Once they are done, crumple up your sheets tightly and spend a few minutes batting them around the room with each other. Have fun with it. Then pick up the sheets of paper and try to smooth out the wrinkles. Have a brief discussion—when you say or do something disrespectful you cannot take it back. (5 min)

## **Materials Needed**

- Book: Chrysanthemum by: Kevin Henkes
- Watch this Video
- Large sheets of Paper (one for each Girl Scout and adult)
- Markers or Crayons
- If you have your Daisy Guide Book you can use Gloria's story instead if you prefer.
