







Lesson Title Vi—Be a Sister to every Girl Scout

### Lesson Overview:

In this lesson, girls will work on the Be a Sister to Every Girl Scout petal (violet).

- Talk about what it means to be a sister to every Girl Scout. Is this the same as being friendly?
- Read or Watch Video of the story Making Friends is an Art! Continue discussion.
- Write a letter (or email) to all of the members in your troop.

### Girl-Led Component

Ask your Girl Scout questions about what they can do to Be a Sister to Every Girl Scout.











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# Lesson Delivery

- Say the Girl Scout Promise and Law with your Girl Scout(s).
- Ask for examples of a time when girls have been a sister to other Girl Scouts. (5 min)
- Read the book or watch the video, *Making Friends is an Art!*. (10 min)
- Discuss the story and ask what it means to make friends. Is this the same as being a sister to every Girl Scout? What are some examples of friendly things we can do now for our fellow troop members? (5 min)
- Take some paper and write a letter to each troop member letting them know you're thinking of them. You can use crayons or markers to decorate your letter as well. If you are not able to mail letters, guardians can take pictures of each letter and email them. (10 min)
